CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Stanfield City Council was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Thomas McCann in the Council Chambers located at 150 W. Coe Avenue, Stanfield, Oregon.

ROLL CALL

Members present were Mayor Thomas McCann and Councilors Jack Huxoll, Don Tyrrell, Pam McSpadden, Chuck Gaede, Lynn Weathermon and Gene Jorgenson. Also present were City Manager Scott Pingel, Public Works Director Scott Morris, and Police Chief Bryon Zumwalt.

FLAG SALUTE

Mayor McCann led the audience and members of the Council in the Pledge of Allegiance.

GARY HALL – PILOT

Mr. Hall, representing Pilot Travel Centers addressed the City Council regarding the second cent on the Fuel Tax and its effect on their business. Pilot may potentially move out of Stanfield if the Fuel Tax cannot be reconsidered.

City Council Members asked several clarifying questions. Mayor McCann informed Mr. Hall that the council would have to take the information given and consider it. The council will hold a roundtable workshop in the coming weeks in order to discuss Pilot's request.

ORDINANCE NO. 393-2010 – BURNING FOR MUNICIPAL PURPOSES

Mr. Pingel presented an amending ordinance to the Burn Ordinance. Mayor McCann read the ordinance by title and in its entirety. Councilor Jorgenson moved approval of the ordinance. Councilor Huxoll seconded the motion. Mayor McCann then read the ordinance by title for a second time. Councilor Jorgenson moved adoption of the ordinance. Councilor McSpadden seconded the motion. Ayes: Councilors McSpadden, Tyrrell, Weathermon, Jorgenson, Gaede and Huxoll. Nays: None. Motion carried.

COMMENTS FROM THE AUDIENCE

OTHER BUSINESS

Chief Zumwalt informed the council that three police vehicles had been decommissioned and were ready to be declared surplus. The City will attempt to sell the vehicles via a sealed bid with a minimum of \$500 per vehicle.

Councilors Jorgenson and Tyrrell moved and seconded approval of declaring 3 police vehicles surplus. Ayes: Councilors McSpadden, Tyrrell, Weathermon, Jorgenson, Gaede and Huxoll. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Mr. Pingel informed the council that the RFQ for engineering services would be published in the East Oregonian on Thursday, December 23.

Mr. Pingel also informed the council that the new population estimate for Stanfield from Portland State University is 2315.

COMMENTS FROM THE COUNCIL

Mayor McCann asked about the property near the pond/track area on the southeastern part of the City. The property is in foreclosure, and the City will seek it once it has gone through the foreclosure process.

Councilor McSpadden thanked everyone for the Christmas Party and for the help provided to the food bank.

There was general sentiment of thanks for the Christmas Party.

With no other business to consider, Mayor McCann adjourned the regular meeting of December 21, 2010 at 7:53 p.m, with the next meeting scheduled for January 4, 2011.
